Read:

Read the story of Joseph in Genesis 39:13-40:22 and discuss how Joseph responded in times of trouble.

Ask:

- When Joseph found himself in prison did he react in these ways?
- How did Joseph react to the trouble of being thrown in prison? (*he did what was right, focused on others, and remembered that God was in control*)
- Do you think it is possible for us to react the same way Joseph did?

Say:
